## **Dance History**

## Girls of Belfast

Submitted by Alex Mann

Several years ago I came across a book called "The Ball-Room Manual of Contra Dances and Social Cotillions". It was published in Belfast, Maine between 1856 and 1866 as a vest pocket book for the "fancy dances" they were doing and specifically to keep "the good old Contra Dances of our ancestors" alive. Eventually I want to republish this book along with the music and history I have found. I feel the current revival of Contra Dancing in Belfast is very much in the same spirit as the revival of the 1850's and '60's. With that thought in mind, I would like to introduce the dances and tunes from the book to you through the DEFFA newsletter.

To start here is the "home town dance" of Belfast.

Girls of Belfast To "Otis's Quickstep

First couple join right hands, swing half round, give left hand to the second couple, balance four in a line, swing the left hand –

Down the centre, back, cast off -

Ladies chain -

Down the outside, back to place below one –

Forward and back six, first couple swing half round –

Right and left.

Note: In the 1850's a swing was much like a right or left allemande, hence "join right hands, swing half round".
